Admission Overview

Admission Requirements

- Must have completed through the 10th grade of high school before attending KAMS.
- Successfully complete high school Algebra II and Geometry before attending KAMS.
- Receive a score of a 23 ACT composite or 1150 SAT composite.

Additional Selection Criteria (including, but not limited to):

- Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Grades in relevant coursework (math & science)
- Class rank
- ACT/SAT subsection scores
- Student essay and short answers
- Evaluations
- Leadership qualities and involvement
- Maturity and motivation

How to Prepare for KAMS & other important program details:

- Take an ACT or SAT exam in the fall of your 10th grade year or earlier.
- Complete additional math & science courses offered at your high school to better prepare for the KAMS curriculum, if possible.
- Complete your high school's specific graduation requirements, such as physical education, history, or foreign language classes.
- Be prepared to seek other opportunities through online coursework, community colleges, or other avenues to complete missing coursework for KAMS admission or program completion.
- PLAN is not accepted. AP courses can be applied to your FHSU transcript pending scores and grades.
- KAMS students are required to live on the Fort Hays State University campus during the academic year (11th & 12th grades). There is not an online option for KAMS.

Admission Timeline

April 1 is the suggested submission deadline for 10th grade applications. We offer a rolling application deadline until all 40 new students spots are filled with qualified students. 9th grade early applicants are encouraged to apply after completing at least <u>one</u> semester of high school.

Once all application materials have been received, the KAMS admission committee will review the materials and notify the student of a decision.
