What are Interactive Study Materials?

Consisting of **Interactive Video**, **Interactive Audio**, and **Interactive Document**, the Interactive Study Materials tools turn students into active, engaged learners with a deeper comprehension and better retention of the taught material.

How do Interactive Study Materials work?

These tools allow teachers to add in-line questions and discussion points to the online study material. They support the flipped classroom method, so students can complete the activity in their own time, pace and place. This results in more valuable in-class discussions.

Why should I use Interactive Study Materials?

This tool:

- Integrates seamlessly into Blackboard: group, grade book and calendar synchronization.
- Provide **extensive student progress oversight** to the instructor.
- Stimulate a collaborative and creative learning environment by encouraging in-depth discussion between peers and peer-groups.
