## In-Text Citation (Author Year)

Sentence containing ideas from a source (Smith 2011).

## Journal Article (print and electronic)

Author(s). Date. Article title. Journal title. Volume(issue):page numbers.

Author(s) of article. Date of publication. Title of article. Title of journal (edition). [date updated; date accessed]; Volume(issue):location.

## Book

Author(s). Date. Title. Edition. Publisher: place of publication.

## Website

Title of Homepage. Date of publication. Edition. Place of publication: publisher; [date updated; date accessed]. Notes.
