Outside of their studies, the RT and DMS students have been busy this semester with many events and activities. Some of these included community service activities organized by the Allied Health student organizations, the Association of Radiologic Technology Students and the Society of Student Sonographers.

In October during Medical Ultrasound Awareness Month, members of the Society of Student Sonographers volunteered as mystery readers for a kindergarten class at Wilson Elementary School in Hays. They read "Ava and Banjo's Ultrasound Adventure!" to the kindergarteners, which tells the story of a young girl who goes to a medical clinic to get an ultrasound examination of her abdomen. In the event that any of the children need to get an ultrasound done, this will help them to understand what to expect.

Early in November, the on-campus RT and DMS students participated in lab demonstrations during the Health and Behavioral Sciences Day. This event included over 120 registered students, consisting of high school juniors and seniors as well as college transfer students interested in careers in the health and behavioral sciences. During the event, students visit all six departments within the College of Health and Behavioral Sciences and have the opportunity to learn about opportunities in each department, tour the facilities, and engage with students, faculty, and staff.

In mid-November, just in time for Thanksgiving, students in the Allied Health and Health and Human Performance Departments gathered 320 items for the Tiger Food Pantry. The Tiger Food Pantry supports many students, faculty, and staff members within the FHSU community with readily accessible healthy food as well as nutrition information.

We are proud of our students for taking the initiative to engage with members of the community, prospective students, as well as members of the University through various service opportunities!

Equipment Update in the Department

Our department is elated to share the news of several pieces of updated equipment in the RT lab! The equipment update included two mammography units, a C-arm, as well as a portable X-ray machine with a DR plate. The equipment was installed during the winter break for use this spring semester.

Alumni Spotlight - Brian Ralph '83

What degree(s) did you earn from FHSU?

I graduated from Fort Hays State University in a class of ten with an AS in Radiologic Technology and a BS in General Science in 1983.

Where have you taken your career since graduation? Have you pursued any further education?

After graduating from FHSU, I took a position as a staff technologist at St. Anthony Hospital, which after a hospital merger became Hays Medical Center. I had the opportunity to cross-train into ultrasound, nuclear medicine, CT, and special procedures. I received a BA in Healthcare and Administration from Ottawa University Kansas City in 1990. I realized a purely administrative role was not going to be the career goal for me. When the opportunity arose to attend the newly formed Radiology Practitioner Assistant program through Weber State University in Ogden, Utah, my family was fully supportive. I graduated in 1999 with seven of my original ten classmates with a BS in Advanced Radiologic Sciences. My role currently as a Radiologist Assistant is to provide fluoroscopic studies in rural facilities and to attend medical staff meetings to facilitate communications between Plains Radiology Services and our client facilities.

What is something you enjoyed about the Allied Health Department or the program(s) offered?

While a student at FHSU, we were assigned to rotate through three hospitals and an orthopedic clinic for clinical experience. I believe those rotations provided the FHSU students with many different clinical situations and an excellent foundation allowing us to excel after graduation.

What advice would you give someone thinking about a career in medical imaging?

Many of my classmates received additional degrees and went into education or Physician Assistant programs. The medical imaging field has bloomed since I went through the program and there are many areas in which to specialize. There are plenty of jobs available in all aspects of imaging services.
