Welcome to the Adelheid Museum of Modern Art—where the past meets the present, and the possibilities for creative exploration are endless.










Almelo Logo Design 2022

Rip the Script

This project began as a "Modes of Working" assignment, but it quickly evolved into a personal exploration of identity and expectations. The concept started as a cinematic vision: I could see the scenes in my mind, each carefully composed like stills from a film. While thrifting one day, I stumbled upon three dolls with perfect, round eyes. They immediately struck me as the ideal props to bring my vision to life, in addition to being a great representation of my siblings. Their uncanny perfection embodied the themes I wanted to explore, and they sparked the idea of incorporating myself as a character into the narrative.

The decision to dress as a doll myself came naturally as I began reflecting on the broader theme of girlhood, particularly the experience of growing up with three sisters. My two eldest sisters, in particular, were affected by the toxic expectations placed on women during the 1990s—a time when the pressure to conform to societal ideals of femininity was not hidden in the slightest. As women, we are still often expected to be flawless, mild-tempered, and endlessly self-sacrificing-silent servants to the needs of others, rarely allowed to express frustration, ambition, or independence.

The "Rip the Script" series explores what happens when we reject these molds. Through the lens of these photographs, staged and shot entirely in my home, I imagined the dolls breaking free from their rigid roles, challenging the societal scripts imposed on them. The setting of my home added intimacy and authenticity to the project, allowing me to control every element of the composition while transforming familiar spaces into scenes of rebellion and transformation.

The process of staging the shots was as intentional as the themes themselves. Each photo was designed to juxtapose the eerie perfection of the dolls with moments of defiance, subverting expectations of femininity and perfection. This series is not just a visual story—it's a reflection on the strength required to dismantle the roles we're expected to play and an invitation for others to question the scripts handed to them.

narratives shape our lives.

The second series, "In Passing," focuses more intimately on my own childhood home and my relationship with my parents. It examines the nuances of "home"-the spaces that hold our memories, both the comforting and the complicated-and the dynamics of familial relationships that evolve over time.

My photography work is a reflection of my contemplative nature and my ongoing exploration of how we perceive the world around us. I love to distill moments that might otherwise go unnoticed, capturing the subtle complexities of everyday life. Digital photography allows me to experiment with light, texture, and composition in ways that reveal new perspectives. Slight shifts in angle or focus can alter how we interpret a scene, giving ordinary moments an added layer of meaning.

In this exhibition, I am presenting two distinct photo series that delve into themes of family and interpersonal relationships—subjects that are deeply human. The first, "Rip the Script," is an exploration of broader societal dynamics and how we challenge, conform to, or break away from inherited patterns of behavior. This series reflects my ongoing curiosity about the roles we play in the stories we tell ourselves and others, and how these








