Remarks for 2024 Fall Colloquia.

## 1) Introduction & Reasons to Celebrate

- a. Professor of Philosophy, 23<sup>rd</sup> year teaching & 13 years chair
- b. Convocation is good time to celebrate the many virtues of FHSU:
  - i. Affordability, esp for 1st Gen and underrepresented
  - ii. Innovation: across modalities
  - iii. **Pride in doing more with less**: overcoming challenges, e.g. pandemic
- c. However, virtue taken extreme= vice: I fear have reached pivotal moment

## 2) Challenges Yesterday

- a. AAUP formed 30 years ago to fight against an administration tempted to represent FHSU primarily as a business
- b. This is a category mistake: FHSU is not a business and its value to our students, our scholarly disciplines and our community go far beyond dollars and cents.
- **3)** Challenges Today: Unfortunately, statewide challenges have multiplied and *continue to threaten the very idea of university as a public good*. To wit:
  - i. Relentless defunding of state schools
  - ii. Flattening of Gen Ed programs
  - iii. Politically driven program review process
  - iv. Attacks on disciplinary expertise and vulnerable students
  - v. For example: Emporia State's firing of tenured faculty
  - vi. **AAUP Summer Institute Take Away**: these aren't local, or fleeting issues; but rather, well-funded, national political initiatives targeting Higher Education...

- 4) How to Push Back? We need to explain and defend the value of a university education to our neighbors, families, and friends. *That is most effective when done collectively:* 
  - a. If you do not have a seat at the bargaining table, you're on the menu!
  - b. Good news
    - i. National: AAUP-AFT Partnership
    - ii. Regional: 3 state chapters: bargaining @ KU
    - iii. Locally: AY 2023-24 we hosted listening sessions and faculty survey
      - 1. We need to do a better job of educating colleagues on role of the union and the nature of the MOA
      - 2. Stay tuned: Prioritizing faculty goals for Spring 25 bargaining year.
