Community Achievements *(Highlights of community events and programs)*

An expansion agreement was reached with Alpha Kappa Lambda Fraternity to join our community in Spring 2016. The community participated in the nationwide #ReThinkGreek campaign, to highlight positive impacts of Greek Life. The community sponsored the Social Excellence Speaker during Tiger Impact. A record number of 111 women registered to participate in sorority recruitment. 51 women accepted membership invitations on Bid Day and 100% of those women were retained through initiation. Over 100 new members attended Greek 101, which serves as an introduction to the fraternity/sorority experience. The community sponsored Hazing Prevention Week including the documentary HAZE. The community sponsored with annual Tiger Bonfire during Homecoming and over 1,000 people attended. Panhellenic cosponsored the Silent No More Walk with Women's Leadership Project and over 100 people attended. Interfraternity Council held No Shave November to raise awareness for testicular cancer. An All Greek Formal was held with members of all seven chapters attending to foster interfraternal friendships. Interfraternity Council President, Traynor Whitehead, and Advisor, Jacob Ternes, were named FHSU Men of Merit. Order of Omega honor society initiated eight student members and one honorary member. The community sponsored the annual Tree Lighting Ceremony for the holiday season and over 200 people attended.
