## What counts as an Honors Experience?

- Honors Program Courses: Freshman Seminar, Critical Thinking, Senior Capstone.
- Designated Honors Courses: Vary by semester, some are offered on a rotation.
- Approved Honors Experience Contracts: Research, Campus or Community Service, or Course Conversion.
- Approved Automatic Honors Experiences: competitive academic programs, conference presentations, peer-reviewed or juried works, nationally competitive scholarship application with advisor, national officership, Honors staff or mentor positions, study abroad, and internships. (Others as approved.)

If you completed PHIL 100, or an associate degree, prior to joining the Honors College you will be exempt from the Honors Critical Thinking course. You can still take the course as an Honors Experience, if you would like.
