Each year, Fort Hays State's Robbins College of Business and Entrepreneurship (RCOBE) recognizes an outstanding faculty member from each of its four academic departments.

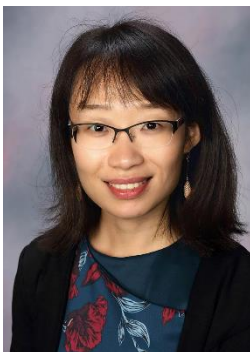
