COLLEGE ALGEBRA PILOT USE OF OER INSTEAD OF COMMERCIAL RESOURCES

Bader Abukhodair and Michelle Zeng, instructors in FHSU's department of mathematics, received an Open Textbook Grant to develop and pilot a College Algebra course. An OpenStax College Algebra Textbook is assigned with MyOpenMath online homework system in place of Pearson's textbook and software. Blackboard integration and mapping of state objectives were done with the guidance of the TILT professionals at FHSU. The new adaptation saved students between 14,000 to 20,000 this semester.
