Overview: The Early College Programs at Fort Hays State University provide a residential learning experience for exceptional high school juniors and seniors with an interest in mathematics and science. Over the course of the two years, students receive 68 hours of college credit, earn their high school diploma, conduct hands on research, develop leadership and civic engagement skills, and participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Points of Pride:

- The KAMS/AMS graduating class of 2024 achieved an average composite ACT score of 31. Students who score a 31 ACT composite score are in the top 95th percentile out of the 1.9 million students that participated in the ACT in 2023-2024.
- ➤ The KAMS/AMS graduating class of 2024 received a little over 2.5 million dollars in scholarships even though it was a small class of 21 students.
- ➤ Early College Programs graduated the sixth official class of AMS students. AMS students hailed from China and South Korea.
- Academic Excellence: 18 students earned a perfect 4.0 GPA in the fall of 2023. 15 students earned a perfect 4.0 GPA in the spring of 2024.
- Academic Excellence: 31 students earned Dean's Honor Roll recognition in the fall of 2023. 29 students earned Dean's Honor Roll recognition in the spring of 2024.
- > KAMS senior, Krish Patel was named a "Hansen Scholar" by the Dane G Hansen Foundation.
- KAMS seniors Elijah Beauchamp and Emma Cohn were selected and presented their research at the Undergraduate Research Day at the Capital in Topeka, KS.

Focus Areas for 2023-2024:


- Continue to focus on increasing applications for domestic students. The goal is to grow to capacity of 40 domestic students for the entering class for Fall 2025. Challenges to hurdle include: public high schools increasingly offering STEM curriculum, discounted college credit, and families not aware of the program. Part of our recruitment strategy this year included the Director Sherri Matlock attending information sessions along with our recruiter, Jenner Little. The Assistant Director, Suellyn Stenger, was also active by reaching out to prospective students and maintaining contact with them and their families. Several times throughout the year the Directors met on weekend with students and their families because it worked out best for the families' schedules. We also used social media more to increase visibility. At this time, we have increased our KAMS students by 50% going from 16 students to 24 students.

- Continue to focus on increasing applications for international students. The goal is to grow to capacity of 40 international students for the entering class for Fall 2025. We renewed the incentive program for two years with all agents, China, Korea, Georgia and Taiwan. This is a graduated bonus system in which agents receive a one-time bonus for students that they recruit. For Fall 2024, AMS is up 243% going from 7 students to 24 and possibly 27. The Director was able to recruit in China for the first time since the pandemic. This along with the incentive seem to be

- key in our growth. The incentive program is in effect for one more year. In-person recruitment will continue.
- ➤ This AMS recruitment cycle was very productive with China (25 -27 students) We are holding numbers about the same with Korea (10 students). Our partnership in the county of Georgia has not yielded a student yet. Last fall we sponsored a "table" at LEAF's educational fair but did not attend in person. Our newly created partnership with Lincoln Management Group in Taiwan has not yielded students yet. This will be a goal for next year.
- Agents tell us consistently that they need a summer program to attend. This is in the works for Summer 2025.
- Our total enrollment for the KAMS/AMS programs for the 2023-2024 academic year was 54 students. We started the year at 51 (including a TMP-M boarder) and added 3 students in January. These students will be here for five semesters instead of four.
- Establish additional international partnerships for admission, research, and cultural exchange. A few examples of this include:
 - Last year, we were able to create an incentive program for our international partners.
 Markham (international agency from China) was the only agency able to capitalize this academic year, but every agency we have spoken to, sees this as a great way to increase overall numbers.
 - O This was the second year that Early College Programs housed minor students who do not attend KAMS or AMS. Last year, we created the "TMP Boarding Program" where TMP international students could have a choice of staying in Custer Hall or with a host family connected with TMP. One TMP Boarders lived in Custer Hall for the 23-24 academic year down from 3 the year before. I anticipate that this number will remain small and fluctuate depending on the year. Not only did this provide diversity to our campus and spread goodwill to TMP, it provided FHSU/Res Life with a few additional dollars for housing from these students.
 - o In spring of 2024, we provided a cultural, geological, and historical trip that focused on the St. Louis, MO and Kansas City areas. A total of 19 KAMS and AMS students participated. This trip was in conjunction with our FRC (FIRST Robotics Competition) inaugural competition.
- This was our fourth year of our transcript partnership with TMP High School. TMP houses our international students' transcripts. We feel strongly that this is a valuable partnership and that TMP's service to our staff and students has once again been phenomenal. Our goal is to strengthen this partnership with TMP and even create a "pipeline" of AMS international students that attend TMP for 9th and 10th grades before coming to FHSU for AMS. Some of this will also be done through our ability to host the "TMP Boarding Program" here in Custer Hall, which is mentioned above.
- Continue to focus on social/emotional/mental health and support for our KAMS/AMS students. This is the fifth year of our "Weekly Wellness Sessions" where staff members from KAMS/AMS create a variety of wellness activities for students to participate in throughout the year. Ten students took the Mental Health First Aid Course which was newly offered.
- This is the fifth year for our evening college application counseling sessions for our seniors. Numerous sessions took place in the fall 2023 semester for our seniors. These consisted of very individualized advising sessions where our Assistant Director (Suellyn Stenger) worked one-on-one with students. Our goal is to continue to provide these evening work sessions. In addition, we hope to increase the number of students attending each of these evening work sessions.

- We hosted two parent zoom meetings summer of 2023 to discuss the newly updated handbook which includes more gender-inclusive language. Dennis King, AVP for Enrollment Management, and Amy Schaffer, Compliance Office, attended. Custer Hall policies were also updated to be more gender inclusive. This was done with the help of university legal counsel and Title IX coordinator. 2023-2024 year went smoothly with these new policies.
- Curriculum changes were stable this year. Added flexibility continues to assist with retention, mental health and assisting students in meeting their future goals. Students have requested that there is more flexibility in the science requirements. Could they take three courses yet have the option to take two in one area and not take one of the disciplines (Biology, Chemistry or Physics). This will be taken into consideration in the future.




















